
Kalamazoo Township 2019 Recycling & Bulk Pickup Calendar



Please note: if your pickup day falls on or after a major holiday, your service will be provided one day later.

Bulk Trash

Pickups occur in April, July, and October (see calendar for 2019 dates). Up to 7.5 cubic yards -- less than the volume of 3 garbage truck hoppers -- may be set out. Items contained in boxes and clear plastic bags are OK, but no colored plastic bags. The following is a partial list of unacceptable items: leaves, brush or other yard trimmings, household waste, carpet rolls wider than 4', rocks, concrete, hazardous waste, major building materials, car parts, tires, heavy iron, or objects weighing more than 50 lbs. *Items must be able to be lifted safely by one person.

Republic Services Transfer Station located at 3432 Gembrit Circle is open year-round for waste disposal for a modest fee.

Leaves and Brush

Pickups are the first full week in May and the weeks before and after Thanksgiving.

Place leaves in paper yard bags; NO PLASTIC BAGS. Tie brush (less than 2" in diameter and 4' in length) in bundles. Do not place loose leaves in the street.

Hazardous Waste

The Kalamazoo County Household Hazardous Waste Center (269.373.5211) is a free service for Kalamazoo Township residents who want to rid their homes of household chemicals and electronics. Call for hours or go to their website at www.kalcounty.com/hhw.

Unused medication may be disposed of in the RedMed Box in the entrance to the KTWP Police Station on Mt. Olivet.





Acceptable Items For Recycling

- · Corrugated cardboard
- Boxboard & cereal boxes
- · Paper towel rolls
- · Paper bags
- Mixed office paper & file folders
- · Newspapers & advertising inserts
- Magazines & junk mail
- Telephone books & soft cover books
- Hard cover books (covers removed)

- · Aluminum cans, foil & pie tins
- Tin, steel & bi-metal cans
- Plastics #1 #7, glass jars & bottles (colored & clear)

**Please make sure your recyclables are empty, clean and dry before placing them in your recycling container.

The Dirty Dozen

12 items to leave out of your recycling container

- 1. Plastic bags
- 2. Non-recyclable glass (such as window glass)
- 3. Food-contaminated items
- 4. Hazardous materials
- 5. Coated cardboard for frozen food containers
- 6. Organic waste
- 7. Liquids

- 8. Non-recyclable plastic & Styrofoam
- 9. Bagged material
- 10. Diapers or bio-hazardous waste
- 11. Loose shredded paper (put in a paper bag)
- 12. Scrap metal (find details at www.ktwp.org
